#### **Local Traffic Committee**

#### **Background**

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is legislated as the Authority responsible for the control of traffic on all NSW Roads. In order to deal with the large number and range of traffic related matters, TfNSW has delegated certain aspects of the control of traffic on local roads to Council (under the Transport Administration Act 1988). To exercise this delegation, Councils must establish a Local Traffic Committee (LTC) and obtain the advice of the TfNSW and NSW Police.

#### **Role of the Committee**

The LTC is primarily a technical review and advisory committee which considers the technical merits of proposals and ensures that current technical guidelines are considered. It provides recommendations to Council on traffic and parking control matters and the provision of traffic control facilities and prescribed traffic control devices for which Council has delegated authority. The Committee also advises on traffic matters arising from development applications (regulatory signage and line marking only), special events and road safety issues.

#### **Committee Delegations**

The LTC has no decision-making powers. Council must refer all traffic related matters to the Local Traffic Committee prior to exercising its delegated functions. Matters related to State Roads or functions that have not been delegated to Council must be referred directly to the TfNSW or relevant organisation.

The Committee provides recommendations to Council. Council is not bound by the advice of its LTC. Council can choose not to proceed with a recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee by not endorsing it at a Council Meeting where the minutes are presented.

Should Council wish to act contrary to the advice of the Committee or if that advice is not supported unanimously by the Committee members, Council must write to both the TfNSW and NSW Police, who may then choose to appeal to the Regional Traffic Committee within 14 days.

#### **Committee Membership**

The LTC is made up of four formal voting members. The members are as follows:

- one representative of Council as nominated by Council;
- one representative of the NSW Police from each Local Area Command (LAC) within the LGA;
- one representative from the TfNSW; and
- the local State Member(s) of Parliament (MP) or their nominee.

Where the Council area is represented by more than one MP or covered by more than one Police LAC, representatives are only permitted to vote on matters within their electorate or LAC.



The role of the four voting members is to:

- review the information provided to the committee.
- advise whether or not the technical justification of facilities meet the relevant guidelines and standards (facilities include lines, signs and devices).
- ensure that the recommendations conform to the matters being referred to and should be recommended for Council to endorse.

#### In relation to this:

- I. The council representatives and Local Members of Parliament (or representative) typically consider the interests of Council and its constituents. Both representatives on the Committee provide valued local knowledge.
- II. The Transport for NSW (TfNSW) representative provides advice on compliance of the matters with regards to various standards and guidelines.
- III. The NSW Police representative provides input on implications for the road network, particularly where a proposal may affect road safety.

The Committee may also have additional informal (non-voting) advisors. These may include:

- Council Officers
- Chamber of Commerce representatives
- Bus Operator representatives
- Other representatives as determined from time to time.

The informal advisors are not required to attend every LTC meeting. Their attendance is only necessary when items appear on the Agenda which affect their area of expertise or responsibility. The informal advisors are not entitled to a vote.

Please note there is no public gallery for these meetings.

#### LTC Business Paper

Council is responsible for preparing an LTC agenda and circulates to all formal members and informal advisors of the committee approximately one week prior to the meeting. This will allow members to fully consider the issues and determine their response on each item.

Council encourages each member of the LTC to undertake a site visit prior to considering any proposal. Site visits may be undertaken individually or organised with Council's Traffic Engineer(s).

SUBJECT: BLUETT DRIVE, SMEATON GRANGE - NO STOPPING

RESTRICTIONS AT WALER CRESCENT

**EDMS #**: 23/243274

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for No Stopping restrictions opposite the Busabout depot driveway in Bluett Drive, Smeaton Grange.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Concern has been raised regarding vehicles parking close to the corner opposite the Busabout depot driveway, impeding buses entering and exiting the depot. Signed restrictions are proposed to address this.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Bluett Drive and Waler Crescent in Smeaton Grange are 13-metre-wide industrial roads with double barrier centre lines on the curves. The Busabout depot is in the north-eastern corner of Bluett Drive where it becomes Waler Crescent, with a combined access/egress. Buses enter and exit the site throughout the day.

When vehicles are parked up close to the curve, the sightlines of buses drivers entering the Depot are impeded. No Stopping restrictions are proposed around the curve to address this (see **Attachment 1**).

Consultation was undertaken with the adjacent owner and no response was received.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the signage be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2023/24 financial year at an approximate cost of \$300.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Following concerns about vehicles being parked opposite the driveway of the Busabout depot, it is recommended that the Committee supports the installation of No Stopping restrictions.




#### **RECOMMENDED**

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Bluett Drive, Smeaton Grange, No Stopping restrictions (R5-400 signage) opposite the bus depot around the inside curve with Waler Crescent.

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SUBJECT: SKAIFE STREET, ORAN PARK - NO STOPPING RESTRICTIONS AT

**CHILDCARE CENTRE** 

**FROM:** Acting Director Community Assets

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for No Stopping restrictions fronting Exploring Tree childcare centre on Skaife Street, Oran Park.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Concern has been raised regarding vehicles parking close to the childcare centre driveway on Skaife Street, impeding on parents entering and exiting the premises dropping off and picking up their children. Signed restrictions are proposed to address this.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Council has received a request from a local childcare centre (Exploring Tree) located at 88 Skaife Street, Oran Park. They have advised that when vehicles are parked near the exit driveway, exiting motorists are finding it difficult to exit due to restricted line of sight.

Skaife Street fronting the centre is a 11.5-metre-wide collector road with a parking lane on both sides. The centre is located along the southern side of the road east of Harvey Street.

When vehicles are parked up to the driveway, drivers are finding it difficult to exit the site due to concerns with line of sight, noting this type of facility has intensified periods of drop off and pick up activity in the morning and afternoon, respectively. To help improve visibility, it is proposed that 10 metres No Stopping restrictions be installed beyond the eastern edge of the driveway (17 metres in total) to address this. (see **Attachment 1**).

To compensate for loss of on street parking, it is also proposed to relocate existing No Stopping sign located 28 metres from the above concerned driveway, a further 10 metres eastwards where street parking can still be safely accommodated.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the new signage be funded from the applicant (Exploring Tree childcare) at an approximate cost of \$500.

#### CONCLUSION

Following concerns about vehicles being parked close to the driveway of Exploring

Tree childcare centre, it is recommended that the Committee supports No Stopping restrictions.

#### **RECOMMENDED**

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Skaife Street, Oran Park:

- No Stopping restrictions (R5-400 signage) across the Exploring Tree Childcare driveway and for 10 metres eastwards (total 17 metres including driveway); and
- ii. Relocating the existing No Stopping sign, located 28 metres east of Exploring Tree Childcare driveway, a further 10 metres eastwards.

SUBJECT: LADY JOSEPHINE GRANGE, GLEDSWOOD HILLS - RELOCATION OF

**BUS STOP**

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the relocation of the existing bus stop on Lady Josephine Grange.

#### **BACKGROUND**

A request has been received to relocate the existing bus stop on Lady Josephine Grange north of Providence Drive to minimise noise impact on adjacent resident.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Lady Josephine Grange is a local road in Gledswood Hills between Providence Drive and Camden Valley Way and indented parking. The 899 bus service from Camden to Catherine Field operates along the road, with an existing bus stop located on the western side just north of Providence Drive.

Concern has been raised about the noise from buses at the stop, which is negatively affecting amenity. The bus stop can be relocated a short distance northward away from houses with minimal impact on the service. It is also proposed to install Bus Zone signage as shown in **Attachment 1**. The new bus stop location would not affect any residents as there is no residential frontage in the vicinity.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$3,000 incorporating concreting and tactile indicators. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2023/24 financial year.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Concern has been raised regarding noise from an adjacent bus stop and it is recommended to relocation it a short distance northward.



#### **RECOMMENDED**

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves at Lady Josephine Grange, Gledswood Hills, north of Providence Drive:

- i. relocation of the existing bus stop on the western side of a further 10 metres northward; and
- ii. 30 metres of Bus Zone signage (R5-20).

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SUBJECT: LARKIN PLACE, CAMDEN - REVIEW OF STREETS AS SHARED

**SPACES PROJECT** 

**FROM:** Acting Director Community Assets

**EDMS #**: 23/126043

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To advise the Local Traffic Committee of the outcomes of the Streets as Shared Spaces project.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Camden Council was successful in receiving the NSW Government's Streets as Shared Spaces grant for the Larkin Place Activation pilot project. The aim of the project was to trial temporary and permanent physical interventions to support local businesses and the community. The six-month pilot has now been completed and this report advises of some of the traffic outcomes of the project.

#### MAIN REPORT

The Larkin Place Activation Pilot tested ideas and opportunities to reimagine Larkin Place as a more people-prioritised space that encourages greater community use and potentially increase business activity. Traffic management measures associated with the project were given concurrence by the Local Traffic Committee on 12 July 2022 as follows:

- i. Entry from John Street converted into a one-way road, subject to a Transport Management Plan approved by Transport for New South Wales;
- ii. Adjustments to parking provisions at the school to include two disability parking spaces and kerb extensions;
- iii. Speed humps; and
- iv. No Stopping along the southern edge of the median island.

Community consultation was undertaken during the pilot period as well as engagement with St Paul's Catholic Primary School. Further to that feedback, disability parking spaces, kerb extensions, speed humps and No Stopping restrictions will be permanently retained. It is planned to extend the footpath along the school frontage in the new financial year.

Significant community feedback was received concerning traffic congestion because of the one-way traffic control in the laneway. This has resulted in a decision by Council to remove the temporary barriers and path and revert the laneway to two-way traffic. TfNSW approval has been provided for a revised Transport Management Plan for this arrangement, as this is not delegated to the Local Traffic Committee. Associated regulatory, signage, linemarking and devices have also been removed as indicated within the green cloud in **Attachment 1**.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

Removal of the temporary barriers and associated measures to reinstate two-way traffic in the laneway is being funded from the Streets and Shared Spaces budget.

#### **CONCLUSION**


Council has undertaken a successful Streets and Shared Spaces Pilot in Larkin Place. Many of the traffic measures are being retailed and a trial one-way in the laneway is being reverted back to two-way traffic movement.

#### **RECOMMENDED**

That the report on Larkin Place, Camden – Review of Streets as Shared Spaces Project by noted.

SUBJECT: DONOVAN BOULEVARD, GREGORY HILLS - EXTENSION OF RIGHT

TURN LANE APPROACHING GREGORY HILLS DRIVE

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek the Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the extension of existing right turn bay on Donovan Boulevard, Gregory Hills.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Traffic congestion is occurring at the western intersection of Donovan Boulevard and Gregory Hills Drive due to the length of the right turn lane. It is proposed to extend the lane length through line marking.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Donovan Boulevard is a collector road in Gregory Hills that intersects with Gregory Hills Drive at either end with traffic signals. At the western end near St Gregory's Collage Junior School forms a T-intersection that is planned to become a four-way intersection through the subdivision of the precinct to the north of Gregory Hills Drive.

A high volume of traffic at the intersection turns right towards Campbelltown. The existing right turn bay is 85 metres long and queuing frequently becomes blocked by right-turning vehicles, leading to traffic congestion. It is proposed to extend the existing right turn lane by a further 85 metres by narrowing the southbound lane from 5.5 metres to 3.5 metres, through line-marking, as detailed in **Attachment 1**.

There are no adjacent properties, so no impact on parking.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$2,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2023/24 financial year.

#### **CONCLUSION**

To help manage vehicle queuing in Donovan Boulevard at Gregory Hills Drive, it is proposed that the existing right turn lane be extended.



#### RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Donovan Boulevard, Gregory Hills, on the approach to the western intersection with Gregory Hills Drive, at the extension of the right lane by a further 85 metres.

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SUBJECT: JAMBOREE AVENUE, LEPPINGTON - PEDESTRIAN REFUGES WITH

ASSOCIATED SIGNAGE AND LINE-MARKING

**FROM:** Director Community Assets

**EDMS #**: 23/262982

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of two pedestrian refuge islands along Jamboree Avenue, Leppington.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Council was successful in obtaining funding from Transport for NSW, as part of the Get Active NSW Program, to design and install pedestrian refuge islands along Jamboree Avenue as a measure to improve amenity for pedestrians. Two locations with associated signage and line-marking are the subject of this report.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Council has been successful in obtaining funding to design and construct pedestrian refuge islands along Jamboree Avenue. Devices are proposed near the intersections with Weir Street, Scout Street, Palaver Street and Baden Powell Avenue (see **Attachment 1**).

The Weir Street and Scout Street locations are detailed in this report (see **Attachments 2** and **3**). Community consultation has been undertaken with adjacent owners and occupiers with feedback as follows:

#### **Weir Street Location**

One response was received opposing the proposal, listing the following concerns:

 Crossing at the intersection should not be encouraged but should rather be 20-30 metres away.

Council response – The crossing has been placed on the pedestrian desire line. Placing it further from the intersection would significantly reduce the benefit as well as result in loss of on street parking. The device near the intersection is also anticipated to result in slower and safer driver behaviour.

 A roundabout at the intersection would be a safer option; also the street lacks speed humps.

Council response – a roundabout will not fit within the current road reserve and would not serve pedestrians as well. The Australian Standard advises against speed humps on collector roads. This is due to the impact on amenity because of noise, and on bus services and emergency services.

• The proposed positioning would impact on buses entering and exiting

Council response – The design has been amended the design to accommodate the bus stop has been relocated.

• It is not clear if there will be concrete making up the pedestrian refuge for the entire length.

Council response – The device involves a combination of concrete at the island and line-marking on approaches, as per the relevant standards.

• The feature would sterilize the vacant lot limiting the location of their driveway.

Council response – The device is not considered to limit the driveway location. Affected owners and occupiers were consulted. No responses were received specifying these concerns.

#### **Scout Street Location**

One response was received, from Campbelltown City Council which owns the adjacent Willowdale Park. They generally supported the proposal with consideration suggested for additional traffic calming. As noted previously, speed humps are not advised in this context by the Australian Standard.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The cost of the project will be entirely funded from the Get NSW Active grant funding received by Council.

#### CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding pedestrian amenity along Jamboree Avenue, to address the concerns it is proposed to install four pedestrian refuge islands.

#### **RECOMMENDED**


The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Jamboree Avenue, Leppington:


- i. A pedestrian refuge with associated signage and line-marking on the southern side of the intersection with Weir Street, as detailed in Drawing Number 2022-042 Sheet 6 of 8; and
- ii. A pedestrian refuge with associated signage and line-marking on the southern side of the intersection with Scout Street, as detailed in Drawing Number 2022-040 Sheet 6 of 8.

SUBJECT: FRANZMAN AVENUE, ELDERSLIE - LINE-MARKING AT THE

INTERSECTION WITH LODGES ROAD

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for a line-marked median island and arrows at Franzman Avenue, Elderslie.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Concerns has been raised about delineation at the intersection of Franzman Avenue with Lodges Road. Line-marking is proposed to address the issue.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Franzman Avenue is a local access road in Elderslie on the western side of Elderslie Public School which forms a T-intersection with Lodges Road at the southern end.

The precinct has been planned for a four-way roundabout intersection, subject to subdivision of a property on the southern side. Franzman Avenue has been future proofed to accommodate the roundabout which has resulted in a wide splay. Concerns have been raised that poor driver behaviour sometimes occurs.

As an interim measure to clearly delineate left and right turning movement a line-marked median is proposed with arrow line marking (see **Attachment 1**).

The treatment will not have any effect on kerbside parking.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the signage be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2023/24 financial year at an approximate cost of \$2,500.

#### **CONCLUSION**

To help address concerns with the intersection of Franzman Ave with Lodges Road it is recommended that the Committee supports additional delineation.

#### **RECOMMENDED**

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves at Franzman Avenue, Elderslie, on the approach to Lodges Road, a line marked median island and directional arrows.

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SUBJECT: LONGHURST STREET, ORAN PARK - CENTRE LINE-MARKING AT

**LARKHAM STREET** 

**FROM:** Acting Director Community Assets

**EDMS #**: 23/284393

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of centre line-marking on approach to the intersection of Larkham Street with Longhurst Street, Oran Park.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Concern has been raised regarding motorists cutting the corner when manoeuvring at the intersection. Line-marking is proposed to help address the issue.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Longhurst Street and Larkham Street are 9.6 metre wide primary access roads in Oran Park. They intersect at a four-way intersection with Give Way controls on the Larkham Street legs. There are kerb extensions on bother roads which narrow them to 6.4 metres wide at the intersection.

Concerns have been raised regarding manoeuvring from Longhurst Street into Larkham Street compromising the safety of on-coming vehicles. To help address the issue double barrier centre lines are proposed on all approaches to the intersection to assist motorists in maintaining their lane (see **Attachment 1**).

Community consultation was undertaken with affected owners and occupiers, but no responses have been received.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$1,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2023/24 financial year.

#### **CONCLUSION**

Double barrier lines are proposed at the intersection of Longhurst Street and Larkham Street to provide additional delineation to motorists negotiating the intersection. It is recommended that the Committee supports this measure.






The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Longhurst Street, Oran Park, at the intersection with Larkham Street:

SUBJECT: MINORCA CIRCUIT, SPRING FARM - CENTRE LINE AT CURVE

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of double barrier lines at the curve on Minorca Circuit, Spring Farm.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Concerns have been raised regarding vehicles being parked on a curve on Minorca Circuit, Spring Farm, creating road safety concerns for motorists. Line-marking is proposed to address this.

#### **MAIN REPORT**

Minorca Circuit is a local access road that is 7 metres wide. Parking is unrestricted along both sides.

Due to the road width and the sharp curve along the north-eastern end, vehicles are forced to travel onto the opposing side of the road if there is a vehicle parked at the location, presenting a hazard.

It is proposed to install double barrier (BB) lines to assist in managing traffic. **Attachment 1**. The double barrier lines will legally restrict parking along the adjacent kerb due to the width of the roadway.

Owners and occupiers adjacent to the proposal have been consulted. No responses were received.

#### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost if line marking will be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2023/24 financial year at an approximate cost of \$500.

#### **CONCLUSION**

To address concerns regarding parked vehicles and driver behaviour at the bend on Minorca Circuit it is recommended that the Committee supports double barrier lines.



### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of a pedestrian refuge crossing on Kavanagh Street, Gregory Hills.

### **BACKGROUND**

Council was successful in obtaining funding from Transport for NSW, as part of the Get NSW Active Program, to design and install a pedestrian refuge island along Kavanagh Street as a measure to improve amenity for pedestrians.

### MAIN REPORT

Kavanagh Street is a 10.5-metre-wide collector road with existing edge line marking and double centre line marking. An Overview Plan is shown in Attachment 1.

It is proposed to install the pedestrian refuge island west of the intersection with the western end of Wallarrah Circuit (see Attachment 2). The device will seek to primarily accommodate pedestrians crossing the road to attend the adjacent Gregory Hills Town Centre and the Gregory Hills Public School to the north.

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupiers. One response was received in support but with the following additional feedback:

Pedestrian crossings be marked along the feature and installation of a pedestrian crossing along Wallarah Circuit.

Council response: The crossing has been future proofed for potential upgrade to a zebra crossing, which would also require flood lighting. This is not within the current scope.

Speed cushions on approach to the proposed feature.

Council response: The Australian Standard advises against speed humps on collector roads. This is due to the impact on amenity because of noise, and on bus services and emergency services. However, Council will continue to monitor speeds on this road.

### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The cost of the project will be entirely funded from the Get NSW Active grant funding received by Council.



### **CONCLUSION**

Concerns have been raised regarding pedestrian amenity along Kavanagh Street. To address the concerns, it is proposed to install a pedestrian refuge island.



### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the extension of timed No Parking restrictions in Richardson Road, Narellan.

### **BACKGROUND**

Concern has been raised about the lack of drop off and pick up provision along Richardson Road, Narellan, adjacent to Narellan Public School. It is proposed to increase the provision to address this.

### **MAIN REPORT**

Richardson Road is a 13-metre-wide collector road which intersects with Camden Valley Way and bounds Narellan Public School on the eastern side. Council has been requested to consider extending the timed No Parking (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm - 4pm school days) restrictions to provide additional drop off and pick up provision for the school.

Reduction of the No Stopping restriction towards Camden Valley Way is not supported to ensure the intersection remains clear. However, there is an opportunity to shorter the adjacent Bus Zone to 20 metres as the No Stopping can be utilised for the bus draw in. There is also an opportunity to reduce the No Stopping restriction at the zebra crossing because of the kerb extension. This allows the No Parking restriction to be extended to from 11 metres to 27 metres long (see **Attachment 1**).

Council has liaised with the School who support the proposal.

### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The cost of the recommended work is \$400. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2023/24 financial year.

### **CONCLUSION**

Further to a request to increase the pick-up and drop off bay provision on Richardson Road it is recommended to extend the No Parking zone.



### **RECOMMENDED**

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Richardson Road, Narellan, extension of timed No Parking restriction (8am-9:30am and 2:30pm-4pm school days) (R5-41 signage) to 27 metres long.

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for additional line-marking on Gledswood Hills Drive, Gledswood Hills, at Amberly Street.

### **BACKGROUND**

Concerns have been raised about the approach to a pedestrian refuge island on Gledswood Hills Drive. Additional line-marking is proposed to address the concerns.

### MAIN REPORT

In June 2022 Council constructed a new pedestrian refuge crossing on Gledswood Hills Boulevard in Gledswood Hills to the east of the four-way intersection with Amberley Street and Katnook Way.

Concerns have been raised concerning the eastbound approach that there is insufficient delineation for drivers around the traffic island. The design has been updated to address this concern, as shown in Attachment 1.

There is not impact of the proposal on existing on street parking.

### FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The cost of the recommended work is \$1,500. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2023/24 financial year.

### CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised about delineation in Gledswood Hills Drive and additional line-marking is recommended.

### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for changes to the pick-up and drop-off arrangements at Leppington Public School in Rickard Road, Leppington.

### **BACKGROUND**

Concerns have been raised by Leppington Public School regarding driver conflict along Rickard Road during school pick-up and drop-off times. An interim treatment is proposed to address the concerns until Rickard Road is upgraded to urban standard.

### **MAIN REPORT**

Rickard Road is a two-lane rural collector road with unsealed shoulders along most of its length and kerb and gutter on the eastern side in the vicinity of Leppington Public School. Adjacent to the school, from north to south, are currently 70 metres of No Stopping (drop off and pick up), a northern service road with perpendicular parking, a southern service road for buses only and further southwards, 100 metres of two-hour parking with kerb and gutter. The road is programmed for full urban upgrade in the future, facilitated through the Leppington North development process, with funding identified through the State Government's Special Infrastructure Contribution.

The perpendicular bays are sign posted 2P (8:30am – 6:30am School Days) and reported to be causing driver conflict. Leppington Public School has proposed to remove the perpendicular parking and implement parallel drop off and pick up arrangements along the school frontage. This would be facilitated by installing prefabricated kerbs in the northern service road and removing the bus only restriction in the southern service road.

It is proposed to implement a one-way southbound movement along the pick-up and drop-off area for traffic flow efficiency. The school would facilitate pick up at the southern end. A width of 6 metres would be maintained through the northern service road and line-marked median island and 5.5 metres through the southern service road.

No Right Turn restrictions are proposed into the northern service road to manage traffic flow along Rickard Road and reduce driver conflict. The right turn restriction leading to the staff car park is proposed to be timed (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School Days) The northern restriction will be full-time.

The proposed measures are shown in **Attachment 1**.

The signage and line marking works are estimated to cost \$3,000, reusing much of the existing signage. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year.

### CONCLUSION


To address driver conflict and improve traffic flow at Leppington Public School, it is recommended that the committee supports the various treatments.

PROJECT LOCATION








