Camden covers an area of 206 square kilometres and is bisected by the Nepean River.

The current population is approximately 63,000 (2014 estimate). Despite the considerable growth experienced since the 1980's, Camden has maintained its unique character, based on its historical importance and picturesque rural landscapes.

Your Councillors

Camden Council is divided into three wards (North, Central and South) with three representatives from each ward.

Local Government Elections are held every four years in the month of September.

The main responsibilities of the elected Council are to:

- exercise city leadership;

- be the custodian and trustee of city assets and to account for and manage those assets.

Library Services

Residents are able to become members of Camden Library Services free of charge. To join you will need to complete an application form and show personal identification, with your name and current address.

Council's Library Service provide professional and friendly staff to assist you with your learning and information needs.

Whatever your subject, Council's Libraries have resources both online and in the libraries that can help you find the information you need.

As well as books, the Libraries also have free computer and internet access, Wi-Fi, photocopying facilities, meeting and study rooms.

Council also run a Home Library Delivery Service. This service is free to anyone who is unable to visit the Library due to disability, illness, limited mobility or the need to care for someone in any of those categories.

The Library has a full program of events, from visiting authors and technology workshops to storytime and holiday programs for children and youth. Children's Storytime is held at Camden Library every Tuesday and Thursday and at Narellan Library every Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. BIBS lapsit sessions for 0-18 months are held every Thursday at Camden and every Monday, Wednesday and Friday at Narellan.

RATES & DEVELOPMENT



Rates information

Rates are levied for the 12 month period from 1 July to 30 June and rate instalments are due for payment on 31 August, 30 November, 28 February and 31 May. Council will send out quarterly notices approximately five weeks before each installment is due. Failure to pay by the due date will result in an interest charge.

How to lodge a Development Application

Before you lodge a Development Application with Council be sure you have all the required documentation with you. Speak to the Duty Planner at Council who can assist you with what information will be required for your application.

Development Application forms, information checklists and schedules of fees are available at Council's Customer Service Office or on the website.

Building and development

Council aims to ensure quality development compatible with the existing and future desired character of Camden.

What do I need approval for?

Approval is required for:

- Construction of dwellings;
- Industrial premises;
- Commercial premises;
- Swimming pools;
- Subdivision;
- Dam construction;
- Sand extraction;
- Tree and vegetation removals;
- Rezoning;
- Driveway crossings;
- Places of public entertainment;
- Minor structures (pergolas, awnings etc);
- Advertising signs; and
- Dwelling additions.

If in doubt as to whether you require development approval, call Council or visit our website.

Flood information

The Nepean River, South Creek, tributaries and associated floodplains are a predominant feature of the Camden LGA.

Flooding along these waterways impacts properties within the floodplain to varying degrees.

PETS & PEOPLE



Pets can be a wonderful addition to any family, but the responsible care and management of animals by their owners is a duty that must be taken seriously to ensure safety and wellbeing of our community.

Things to do for your pet when you move house

When people move house they often forget that information about their pets also needs changing in case your pet becomes lost or injured.

Your pet, once microchipped, is placed onto the Companion Animal Register and this information is accessed if your pet becomes lost. Here are important steps to ensure your pet's details are correct and up to date.

1. Make sure your pet is microchipped. Your local vet can assist with this.
2. Once your pet is microchipped visit Council to have your pet lifetime registered.
3. Make sure your pet is wearing a collar and name tag with an up to date contact number.
4. Change your contact details with Council to ensure your new address and phone number are up to date. Forms can be obtained from Council and online at Council's website.
5. If you no longer own a microchipped pet or your pet has recently died, contact Council for assistance with updating your details.

Council must be notified within 14 days of any change that occurs in the registration information for your pet.

Identification and registration

Companion animals (dog or cat) must be microchipped from the time the animal is 12 weeks old by a vet or animal welfare organisation.

Your pet must be registered with Council by six months of age.

This is a separate process to microchipping and can be completed at Council's Customer Service Centres, 70 Central Avenue, Oran Park between 8.30am-5pm, Monday to Friday or at both Narellan and Camden Libraries between 9am-5pm, Monday to Friday.

Off-leash areas

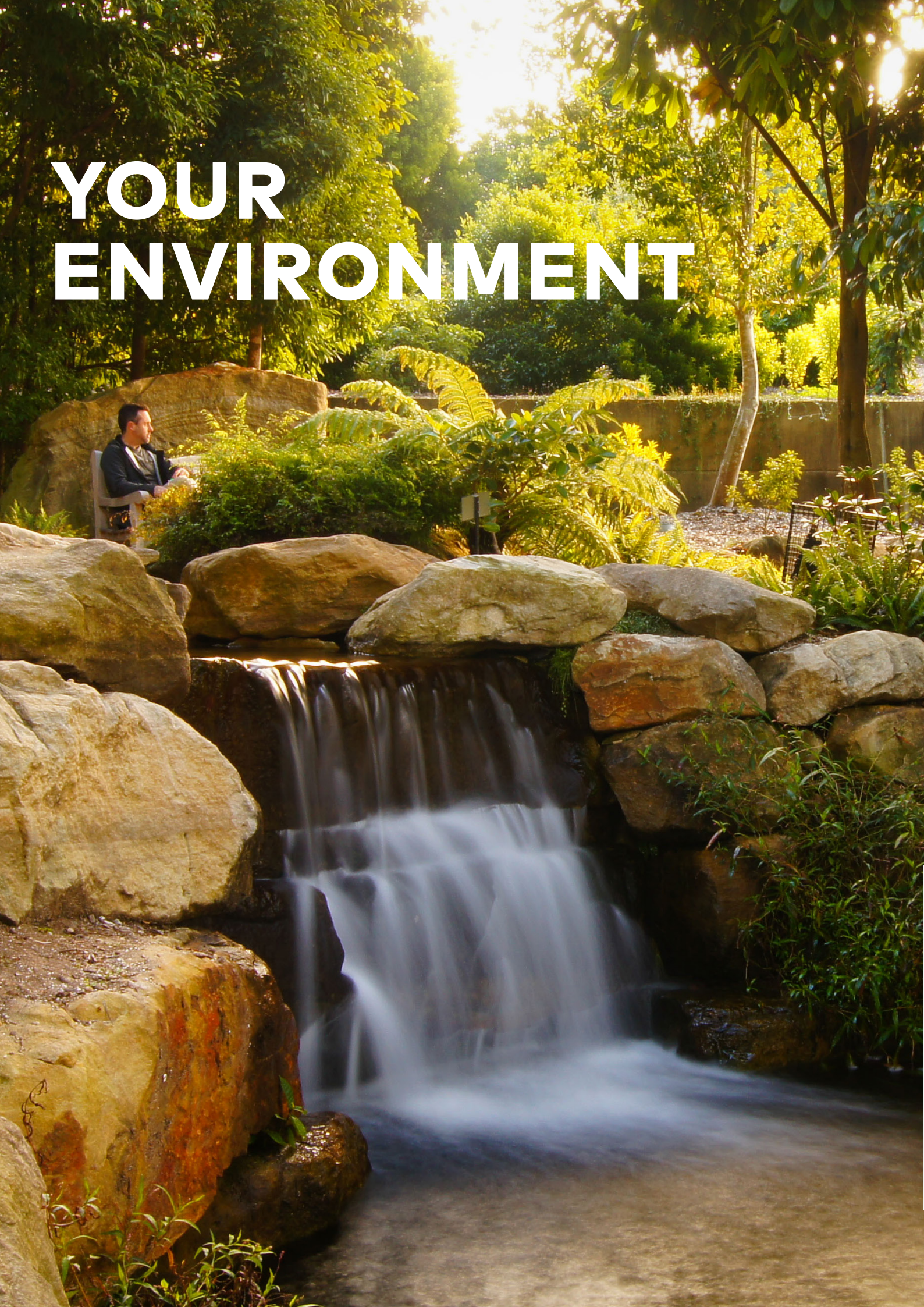
Get active outdoors and take your dog for a walk at one of six off-leash parks located throughout the Camden LGA including;

- River Road Reserve, 42 River Road, Elderslie;
- Bicentennial Equestrian Park - before 10am and after 5pm Monday to Sunday (excluding horse event periods);
- Rosevale Reserve, Rosevale Place, Narellan;
- Clifton Park, Arcadian Hills Estate, Cobbitty;
- Burrell Road, Spring Farm; and
- Holden Drive, Oran Park.

It is the responsibility of the person walking the dog to remove and properly dispose of any dog's faeces.



YOUR ENVIRONMENT



Open burning

Burning in the Camden LGA is prohibited. Exceptions apply for bona fide hazard reduction works, where a Hazard Reduction Certificate has been issued by the Rural Fire Service (RFS). To discuss bona fide hazard reduction works, call 9608 7777.

Some agricultural fires and cooking fires are permitted.

(Note: If a fire is permitted, the NSW RFS, NSW Fire Brigade and Council requirements must be met prior to lighting the fire).

Bushcare and community tree planting events

Residents are welcome to join any volunteer bushcare groups currently working in Council owned bushland area.

Council provides all required training for volunteers. You can learn about weed identification and control, selecting and caring for local native plants and vegetation and providing habitat for local wildlife among other things. You can also participate in community tree planting events such as National Tree Day.

Sustainable Camden

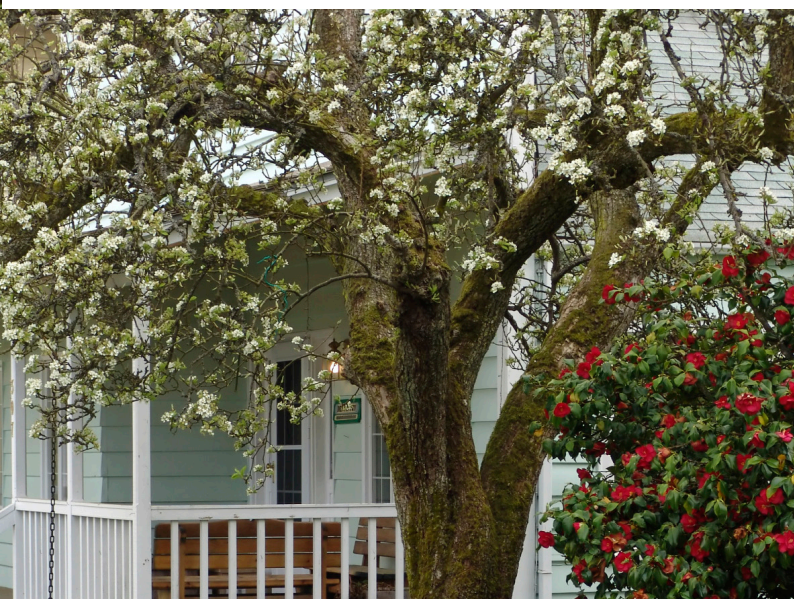
'Sustainability' means many different things to many different people. At its most basic, being sustainable means living a lifestyle that uses as few resources as possible and causes the least amount of environmental damage for future generations to deal with.

The concept of sustainability can apply to almost every part of daily life whether in the home, at work, at school or in the community.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Domestic Waste Collection

Camden Council provides a three bin waste service which consists of a **Recycling bin** a **Green Waste bin** and a **General Waste bin** which are all collected weekly.

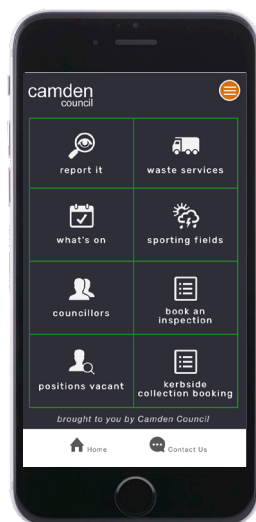
The three bin service is available to all residential properties excluding some rural residents who do not receive a green waste service as they are able to manage their green waste on their property. These residents have their rates adjusted accordingly.

Residents moving into newly constructed dwellings are required to contact Council to initiate their waste service.

Camden's waste service is designed to minimise the amount of waste going to landfill through a combination of the bins provided and waste processing after collection.

Download the "Our Camden" App to:

- **Set a reminder for bin night;**
- **Book a kerbside clean up;**
- **Report a bin lost or stolen; and**
- **Notify Council that your waste was not collected.**



What if my bin is stolen or damaged?

Council can arrange for your damaged or stolen bin/s to be repaired or replaced where necessary.

What are the waste collection times?

Waste collections are conducted Monday to Friday between the hours of 5am and 1pm. Services occur regardless of public holidays For example, Christmas Day, New Year's Day etc.

Collection days

Camden Council collects all waste bins every week. A list of suburb collection days is listed below.

Bins must be placed on the kerbside the night prior to collection with the lid opening to the road. There must be a gap between each bin of at least 30cm with no obstruction from light poles, trees or parked vehicles.

Currans Hill (part of), Mount Annan, Oran Park, Catherine Field

General waste

To make the most of the resources we have, disposing of waste into the red bin should be our last resort. Therefore, to allow for those residents in our community who produce less waste, a range of bin sizes are available.

Having a smaller bin is not only good for the environment, it will save you money. The cost of your waste service varies according to the size of your red bin, and whether the property is in a rural or urban area.

A rule of thumb to help you minimise the garbage you produce is to “Avoid, Reduce, Reuse and Recycle”.

Recycling service

The recycling bin is a co-mingle bin that accepts paper and cardboard, plastics labeled 1-7, tin, aluminium and glass bottles.

The benefit of this system is that residents are not required to sort their recyclables.

Green waste service

The green waste bin is for organic material from your garden such as leaves, twigs and grass clippings. The material is then composted, processed and converted to make garden products such as soil improvers, fertilisers and top soils.

If you reside on a rural property and are not sure if a green waste service is available to your property, please contact Council.

Waste Management Facilities

The closest waste management facility is located at 275 Richardson Road, Spring Farm and is owned and operated by SUEZ Environment.

E-Waste recycling

Camden Council has partnered with SUEZ to create a free E-Waste Recycling Service for residents and small businesses in the Camden Local Government Area.

Residents can now recycle unwanted electronic equipment such as televisions, computers, laptops, peripherals, printers and scanners at the free E-Waste Drop Zone at the SUEZ resource recovery park in Spring Farm.

This free recycling service is available for households and small businesses, with a maximum of fifteen items per customer.

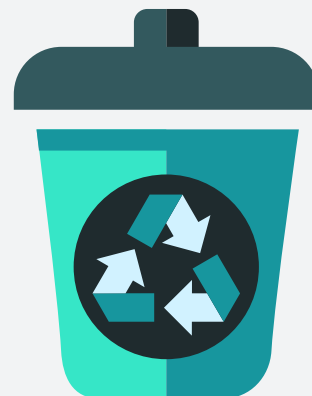
Please note, items such as DVD/VCR players, microwaves, toasters, radios or game consoles are not available for free recycling.

Hazardous waste

Camden Council, in conjunction with the NSW EPA, runs an annual household chemical *CleanOut* program. This service creates a safe and simple opportunity for residents to dispose of household chemicals in an environmentally friendly manner.

Accepted chemicals may include:

- Paint and paint related products (thinners, strippers, varnish etc);
- Pesticides and herbicides (baits, poisons, wood preservatives);
- Solvents and household cleaners;
- Motor oils and fuels;
- Batteries;
- Gas bottles;
- Fire extinguishers;
- Pool chemicals;
- Acids and alkalis; and
- Hobby chemicals (photography etc).

Wastewater

Not all suburbs within the Local Government Area (LGA) are connected to Sydney Water sewer mains. State Government legislation requires all on-site sewage management systems have a current *Approval to Operate*.

New residents can contact Council to arrange an inspection of your on-site sewage management system in order to obtain an *Approval to Operate* for your system.

Kerbside Clean Up

Kerbside collections allow residents to easily dispose of waste that is too bulky for the normal garbage collection. Residential properties are eligible for two kerbside collection services per financial year and must be booked through Council's Customer Service Centre.

Residents must follow these simple steps:

- 1. Make a booking** - 4654 7777
- 2. Get the timing right** - Place your material out no earlier than 48 hours prior to your scheduled collection.
- 3. Get the volume right** - Only three cubic metres of materials in total will be accepted. This keeps the booking service fair and sustainable.

Information to report includes:

- Date and Time;
- Description of the person;
- Description of the vehicle; and registration details.

Living with your neighbour

The best way to address neighbour problems is in a friendly cooperative manner rather than by regulations. Often the person causing the concern is not even aware there is an issue.

Occasionally, disputes cannot be easily resolved between neighbours. In these circumstances you may find it helpful to contact a Community Justice Centre who may be able to help if adjoining owners have difficulty reaching an agreement.

Fencing

There are a number of factors to consider when planning new or replacement fencing for your property including:

- Restrictions or guidelines affecting the height, material or style of fencing appropriate in your area;
- Positioning of the fence; and
- Sharing of the costs.

Citizenship

To apply for citizenship you must be a legal, permanent resident of Australia, be of good character and have resided in Australia for at least two of the last five years. As part of all citizenship ceremonies, the Mayor will outline the rights and responsibilities of Australian Citizenship and the new citizen must take an oath or affirmation of allegiance to Australia.

Signs and banners

Council does not permit signs and banners to be erected on public land including telegraph poles and roundabouts. Council does have a **Signs and Banner Policy** for non-profit organisations. Further information can be found on Council's website.

Noise

We all create noise however the offensiveness of noise can vary from person to person. As a community we have some understanding about what levels of noise are acceptable and what are not.

If neighbourhood noise is a genuine problem for you there are a number of options you can consider including:

- **Talk to People** - try to solve the problem amicably by talking to whoever is causing the noise. Often people do not realise they are being noisy and are happy to work with you to solve the problem, as alternatives are often available.
- **Contact a Community Justice Centre** - If the noise continues, you can contact a Community Justice Centre (CJC). These are government-funded but independent centres that specialise in settling differences between neighbours without entering into complicated legal processes.
- A CJC will suggest a mediation process. This is where you meet with the people who are making the noise, together with a CJC representative, to try and solve the problem. This process will not cost you any money, and has a high success rate.
- **Contact Council or Police** depending on the type of noise and hours it is being emitted. Refer to Council's or the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) website for more information on dealing with neighbourhood noise.

Justice of the Peace

Do you need the services of a Justice of the Peace (JP)? Need a document witnessed or a Statutory Declaration signed?
