#### \$113 MILLION FOR STAGE THREE

Council is setting records to be proud of after it announced the \$113.8 million third stage of its COVID-19 Community Support Package. The significant value packed into Stage Three, or the recovery phase, makes it the biggest package offered to a community by a local council in the country.

Stage Three includes 65 projects and initiatives to be delivered across the next four years that fit into six categories, including:



Infrastructure, with more than \$108 million worth of value to be delivered;



Events, with \$320,000 to be delivered;



Grants and financial assistance, with more than \$350,000 available to residents and businesses;



Local employment, with \$675,000 committed;



Programs, where \$248,000 has been committed: and



City beautification, with almost \$3 million to be delivered.

### SUPPORTING OUR COMMUNITY

















Stage Three, or the recovery phase, is estimated to help boost Camden's local and regional economy by up to \$195 million as well as generate 437 full-time equivalent jobs.

In fact, all three stages of this package will boost Camden's economy by up to \$221.7 million and generate up to 507 new jobs.

In the first 12 months alone, you'll see more than 30 projects from this package get underway. They include:

Upgrades to play equipment at the McCrae Drive Playground, at Ron Dine Reserve; Macarthur Park; Yandel'Ora Reserve; Tredinnick Park in Harrington Park; and Royal George Drive playground in Harrington Park

The extension of the walking track at Camden's Bicentennial Equestrian Park

A virtual employment and education expo Camden Businesses Recovery marketing campaign, which will support local business Grants and financial assistance for the community, including Cultural Activation Grants, Sports Grants and Expanded Community Grants

A Program of Activations to bring the Camden Town Centre, Oran Park Town Park and Birriwa Reserve to life with activities and events

#### NARELLAN SPORTS HUB CONTINUES TO PROGRESS

Work on Stage Two of Macarthur's state-of-the-art sporting mecca, the Narellan Sports Hub, has been progressing.

The work, which started in September 2020, includes additional netball courts, a synthetic athletics track, a full-size rugby league field, a criterium cycling track and a pedestrian and cycle path network. It is due to be completed by the end of the year, weather permitting.

### ORAN PARK ROVERS NEW HOME GROUND

The Mayor, together with representatives from the Oran Park Rovers Football Club, officially opened the Doohan Sportsfields and Clubhouse in April.

The facilities are part of a larger \$6.7 million sporting complex being delivered by Landcom under the Oran Park Urban Release Planning Agreement.

The complex comprises of multiple playing fields, eight tennis courts, two clubhouses, 10 multi-purpose sports courts, four cricket practice nets and an inclusive playground.

Works are expected to be completed mid-year.

### MAJOR PROJECTS



#### CRICKET WORKS SMASHED OUT OF THE PARK

Work on the new cricket centre of excellence at Fergusons Land has been progressing, with Stage One due for completion by the end of the year.

Council has completed the bulk earthworks; installed walls at the amenities building, started bridge construction and have nearly finished the road pavement.

When complete, the \$8.4 million first stage of the state-of-the-art facility will include:

- A cricket oval with turf centre wickets, irrigation and picket fencing;
- Amenities building with toilets, changerooms and storage;
- Carparking facilities;
- Five synthetic practice cricket nets;
- New bridge access over Matahil Creek;
- Maintenance shed;
- Electrical substation; and
- Landscaping.

# WORK CONTINUES ON KIRKHAM PARK BMX FACILITY

Work is progressing on the second stage of the much-loved Kirkham Park BMX Facility.

Stage 2A, which is due to commence in August, will include extensions to the BMX facility and the construction of a high-quality pump track, which will be accessible to the public. The Stage 2A works will also include:

- An eight-metre start hill;
- Elite First Straight;
- Access ramps;
- Warm-up track;
- Marshalling area;
- All weather pump track;
- A storage shed; and
- Associated civil, structural, building and landscaping works.

The design of Stage 2B is nearing completed, with construction expected to begin in early 2022 and be complete by September 2022. It will include:

- Removal of the old BMX track;
- A pedestrian bridge over the drainage channel;
- A new car park; and
- Associated civil, electrical, lighting and landscaping work.

**DID YOU KNOW?** 

As part of Council's Community Support Package Stage Three, there will be more than \$108 million spent on infrastructure projects and almost \$3 million delivered in city beautification projects.

#### PLATYPUSES IN CAMDEN

In February, Council took its first water samples as part of a Platypus Monitoring Program for the Nepean River. The program will help us to better understand the platypus population within the Camden area.

The program uses environmental DNA (eDNA) technology to determine the presence and distribution of the elusive animal. eDNA technology can detect the presence of platypus by analysing water samples collected at various points along the Nepean River.

Council has obtained exciting preliminary results that indicate the presence of platypus in the Cobbitty area. To find out more, and keep up to date with the results of the Platypus Monitoring Program, visit camden.nsw.gov.au/environment/biodiversity/native-animals

#### NEPEAN RIVER LANDHOLDER GUIDE

A landholder guide is available for residents and businesses along the Nepean River to help preserve important remnant native vegetation.

The Nepean River is a significant biodiversity corridor supporting a wide diversity of plants, animals including threatened and endangered species.

The guide has been developed to provide practical information to landowners to help protect, enhance and restore native vegetation on their property as well as information on generating income through conservation.

### BAKER'S FACE TO FACE EXHIBITION

This new exhibition celebrates Baker's early involvement with the Archibald Prize between 1936 and 1972. As a young artist, Baker proudly submitted 27 works over 36 years, the first at a grand age of 21 years. Known for his controversial critique of the emerging modernist movement, Baker's works reflect a change in his technique that was fluid, vibrant and energetic.

Face to Face will feature Baker's 1936 Archibald entry alongside the self-portrait study painted by Normand Baker, Alan's brother in development of his 1937 winning Archibald entry.

### AUSTRALIA DAY CELEBRATED ONLINE

While Australia Day celebrations looked a little bit different this year, Council was delighted to offer an exciting program of events for the community.

Residents took part in a number of online activities, including colouring-in sheets; an historical look at the much-loved parade; a cork hat making workshop; and an Australiana music performance.

The community also took the time to recognise some truly inspirational people. Residents tuned in to watch a message from Camden's Australia Day 2021 Ambassador, George Tonna, who is using his own experience of cerebral palsy as a catalyst for positive action and creating opportunities for others living with disability.

Local foster parent, Silvana Lofaro, was crowned Citizen of the Year at Council's annual Australia Day Awards event, for her selflessness in fostering more than 25 children over the past five years, while also heading the Harrington Park local playgroup Pixies and Munchkins.

Other Australia Day Award winners included:

- Seven-year-old Madison Sillett, who was crowned Young Citizen of the Year for her tenacity in starting her own baking business despite numerous chronic health issues:
- Shining Stars Foundation, which won the Community Group Award for their dedication to providing muchneeded supplies to those in need in the Camden community; and
- Heather Bieman, who won the Arts and Cultural Award, for her commitment to the support and tuition of others as they sought to develop their musical skills.

Council was also honoured to welcome 19 valued members of our growing community, from 10 different countries around the world, who officially started their lives as Australians.
