NARELLAN SPORTS HUB EXPANSION COMPLETE

Narellan is now home to one of south-west Sydney's largest sporting complexes, following the completion of the second and final stage of the Narellan Sports Hub in September.

The facility will see thousands of locals compete across several sporting codes including netball, athletics, rugby league, hockey and cycling throughout the year.

Stage Two work included 14 additional netball courts with floodlighting, a synthetic athletics track, an additional international size rugby league field with new lighting, irrigation and drainage; a multi-purpose field area the size of two football fields; and so much more.

Funding was received from the Western Parkland City Liveability Program, at \$11.3 million, and the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund, at \$5 million, for the design and construction of the Narellan Sports Hub Stage Two works in 2019.

Projects under the Western Parkland City Liveability Program are co-funded by the three levels of government as part of the Western Sydney City Deal (WSCD). The WSCD is a 20-year partnership between the Australian and NSW Governments and the eight Councils of the Western ParklandCity.

INTERNATIONAL STANDARD KIRKHAM PARK BMX **FACILITY NOW COMPLETE**

Australia's best BMX riders will now know all about Camden after the official opening of Kirkham Park BMX Facility.

The \$5.56 million facility boasts an eight-metre start hill; elite first straight; a warm-up track; and much more.

Kirkham Park BMX Facility was completed in two stages, with stage 2A co-funded by Council and the NSW Government's 2019/20 Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund. The pump track formed part of Stage 2A work.

CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON ORAN PARK LEISURE CENTRE

Camden's third local pool is about to become a reality with construction beginning at Oran Park Leisure Centre recently.

Oran Park Leisure Centre, to be located on Central Avenue, will be a significant addition to the Oran Park precinct and is set to include:

- A 50-metre indoor swimming pool;
- · Leisure pool;
- Learn-to-swim pool;
- Spa and sauna;
- Four indoor courts;
- Gymnasium;
- Café;
- Creche facilities; and,
- Undercover parking.

Mayor of Camden, Cr Therese Fedeli, said the Leisure Centre demonstrated Council's commitment to recreation facilities in the Camden area.

"Council has worked hard on providing the community with high quality sport and recreation facilities across the Camden area and Oran Park Leisure Centre will add to our growing list," she said.

"Our community cannot wait for Oran Park Leisure Centre to be completed as it will be home to an Olympic-sized swimming pool which will not only better serve our residents, but also give young children the chance to train to become Australia's next great Olympian."

Council awarded a tender to construct the Leisure Centre in August this year, with works expected to be completed by mid to late 2024, weather permitting.

Oran Park Leisure Centre is being delivered in partnership with Greenfields Development Company.

The Leisure Centre will add to a range of state-of-the-art sporting facilities in the Camden area, including Narellan Sports Hub, Kirkham Park BMX Facility and the area's first synthetic football field at Nott Oval.

MAJOR PROJECTS



FLOOD STUDY

Council has updated a number of flood studies, plans and policies to assist in planning and development matters, as well as to provide support for emergency management planning.

The updated Upper South Creek Flood Study, Nepean River including Narellan Creek Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan and the Flood Risk Management Policy were endorsed by Council in September.

Expert consultants were engaged to conduct studies and plans in accordance with NSW Government requirements in completing the updates.

IT'S TIME TO PAINT CAMDEN REaD

Paint the Town REaD (PTTR) is an early literacy initiative which encourages everyone to read, talk, sing and rhyme with children from birth.

Camden is proudly part of this initiative, with the Camden PTTR run by a local committee made up of local organisations and project partners including Council.

The goal is to introduce Camden kids to key literacy outcomes in their early years so they're ready for reading and writing by the time they start school, and they continue to grow their love of reading and writing into adulthood.

Why is literacy so important at a young age? Simple – when you introduce reading from birth and continue through to childhood, you're helping your child develop literacy skills. These skills help develop your child's brain, as well as social and emotional development.

TWO BEAUTIFUL TRUCKS

Council was proud to unveil two more Waste Trucks with special messages.

The first is for Kids Helpline. Kids Helpline is Australia's only free (even from a mobile), confidential, 24/7 online and phone counselling service for young people aged from five to 25 years old. There are more than 22,000 residents across the Camden area that fall within this age group who are encouraged to reach out to the qualified counsellors at Kids Helpline who are available anytime and for any reason.

The second features a design by local indigenous artist Melissa Barton, also known as Alkiira Indigenous Art. It depicts and celebrates the strength, unity, community, and teamwork shared between the Dharawal, Dharug and Gundangurra people to care for Country in and around Camden.

These two trucks are two of the many community messages we have, with other waste truck artwork including community road safety messages, breast cancer awareness, men's and women's health, mental health and much more.
