

Council was proud to continue spreading the #camdenlove over the past few weeks, with the new 'We're Stronger Together' campaign.



Camden holds a Guinness World Record

Camden, you are World Champions!

Camden has made history after being recognised as a Guinness World Records™ title holder for the largest online quiz!

Council broke the record on Sunday 10 October, with 2,328 participants in the quiz for 92 minutes, officially putting Camden into the Guinness World Records™ for the first time ever.

PEDDLING TO THE FINISH LINE

It's almost time to get on your bike, with the next stage of the Kirkham Park BMX Facility, which commenced in October.

The work, which is set to be complete by March next year, will include:

- An eight-metre start hill structure;
- Additional BMX elite straight;
- Large storage area under the existing five-metre start hill;
- Warm up track and marshalling area;
- Large publicly accessible pump track to cater for all ages and skill levels;
- Associated lighting, electrical and civil works; and
- Shelters and landscaping.

This stage will cost over \$2.78 million and is co-funded by Council and the NSW Government's 2019/20 Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund.

Additional works will be completed in 2022.

NEW AMENITIES AT WANDARRAH RESERVE

Council is kicking goals with the next stage of the Wandarrah Reserve upgrade nearing completion.

The new building, which was designed in conjunction with Mount Annan Mustangs Football Club, includes new change rooms and increased storage. Additional drainage and electrical works were also completed to the original building as part of this stage. The first stage, which was completed in April, included the expansion of the canteen in the original building.

The Wandarrah Reserve upgrade was funded through Council's 2020/21 Capital Works Program.

PLAYGROUND UPGRADES CONTINUE

Playgrounds across the Camden area have been enjoying facelifts thanks to the \$130.6 million investment made as part of Council's COVID-19 Community Support Package.

The most recent playgrounds to benefit are:

- McCrae Drive Playground in Camden South, which has seen the installation of new playground equipment and park furniture, replacement of soft-fall rubber and landscaping works;
- Royal George Drive Playground in Harrington Park, which now has new playground equipment, park furniture, shade sail and soft-fall rubber, as well as new landscaping; and
- Yandel'ora Reserve in Mount Annan, which has seen the installation of new contemporary fitness equipment as well as park furniture and a bubbler, replacement of soft-fall rubber and landscaping works.

Stage One work at Ferguson's Land Cricket Facility

MAJOR SPORTING HUBS

Despite recent disruptions, work at Narellan Sports Hub and Ferguson's Land Cricket Facility have continued, with a number of exciting milestones in view.

Stage Two construction work at Narellan Sports Hub includes:

- An additional 14 netball courts with floodlighting;
- A synthetic athletics track, including field and jump facilities, floodlighting, drainage and irrigation;
- An additional full-size rugby league field to replace the existing smaller 'mod league' field, including floodlighting and drainage;
- An athletics administration/club building;
- An additional 1,150 car parking spaces, in four new areas;
- Internal access roads;
- A criterium cycling track;
- A road and pedestrian bridge over the existing drainage corridor;
- 20,000m² multi-purpose playing field area including floodlighting, irrigation and drainage
- A pedestrian and cycle path network; and
- A major upgrade of the Porrende Street roundabout.

Stage One work at Camden's first premier cricket facility, which is also due to be complete in December, includes:

- A cricket oval with turf centre wickets, irrigation and picket
- Amenities building with toilets, changerooms and storage;
- Carparking facilities;
- Five synthetic practice cricket nets;
- New bridge access over Matahil Creek;
- Maintenance shed:
- Electrical substation; and
- Landscaping.

Both these projects are funded by Camden Council and the Australian and NSW Governments through the Western Sydney City Deal's Western Parkland City Liveability Fund.

TIME TO ENJOY LEISURE **CENTRE IMPROVEMENTS**

It's been fantastic to open our local leisure centres and enjoy the facilities in time for summer, especially with Mount Annan Leisure Centre and Camden War Memorial Pool sporting new upgrades.


The restoration of the spa and sauna facilities at Mount Annan Leisure Centre over the lockdown period included:

- Spa air jet replacements;
- Spa plumbing and electrical upgrade;
- Spa retiling;
- New bench seating, walls and ceiling in the steam room;
- Resealing of the sauna.

Likewise, Camden War Memorial Pool has seen some improvements, including:

- The refurbishment of existing changerooms;
- Resurfacing of the pool;
- A new barbecue area;
- The installation of new shaded areas;
- The replacement of entry building panelling;
- New pool blankets, for heating;
- Floodlighting; and
- Associated maintenance work.

IT'S TIME TO RECYCLESMART

Talk about a match made in heaven – Camden Council has teamed up with RecycleSmart, an app that makes recycling the tough stuff as easy as ordering Uber Eats!

The app provides specific and localised information on how to correctly dispose of over 250 waste items. From glass to batteries, towels to chemicals and even DVDs to kettles, you can now find the answers at your fingertips.

Residents are invited to download the free app and check the next collection day suitable to them. The bookable Power Pickup service is also available through the app, which takes care of problem waste items like soft plastics, clothing and e-waste. Simply:

- Fill a RecycleSmart bag (or your own) with all those tough-to-recycle items and book a Power Pickup in a few clicks; and
- For just \$2 a bag, the RecycleSmart team will come to your doorstep and ensure your waste is properly recycled. Every bag collected is weighed to help you keep track of your recycling records!

At the moment, 20 per cent of red bin waste could be recycled – so help Council keep it out of landfill and keep our community beautiful!

INVASIVE RED-EARED SLIDER TURTLES IN LAKE YANDEL'ORA

Known as one of the world's worst invasive species, redeared slider turtles prey on our native turtles, compete for their food, nesting areas and basking sites and often spread diseases such as salmonella.

At least four red-eared slider turtles have recently been sighted in Lake Yandel'ora in Mount Annan and will be removed by Council and the NSW Department of Primary Industries.

Council is asking residents to help spot, identify and report any red-eared slider turtles. To easily tell the difference between native eastern long-necked turtles and red-eared slider turtles, visit dpi.nsw.gov.au and to report a red-eared slider turtle, visit feralscan.org.au

MAKING NEIGHBOURHOODS COOLER

We're helping keep our neighbourhoods cool by planting 6,000 trees by December 2022 as part of the Greening our City Grant Program (proudly funded by the NSW Government in association with Local Government NSW).

In addition to this, we recently planted 500 nationally threatened Camden White Gums at Elizabeth Macarthur Reserve and are in the process of planting 1,300 street trees. We've also incorporated a large number of trees into the Ferguson's Land Cricket Facility and Stage 2 of the Narellan Sports Hub projects.

Not only do these trees look great, but they'll help provide shade and tree canopy as well as provide habitat and food for native wildlife.
