

MAJOR PROJECTS



Construction continues at Narellan Sports Hub

MILESTONES REACHED AT NARELLAN SPORTS HUB

We've seen big milestones reached at Narellan Sports Hub in the past few months, with Stage Two construction work going from strength to strength.

To date, the Porrende Street roundabout upgrade; full-size rugby league field; pedestrian bridge and two kilometres of shared path; and new carparking for both the rugby league and hockey fields have been completed.

Still to be completed as part of this stage are the additional netball courts; a synthetic athletics track; and a criterium cycling track.

This project is funded by Western Sydney Parkland City Liveability Program and the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund.

COVID-19 COMMUNITY SUPPORT PACKAGE PROJECTS UNDERWAY

Council was proud to set records with the third stage of its COVID-19 Community Support Package announced earlier this year. A number of the 65 projects and programs, to be delivered across the next four years, are well underway.





MAJOR PROJECTS



ALMOST TIME TO GET ON YOUR BIKE

Work is progressing on the second stage of the much-loved Kirkham Park BMX Facility.

Part 2B, which is about to begin, will include:

- A pump track, which will be publicly accessible;
- Warm-up track;
- Marshalling area;
- Decommissioning of existing, publicly-available track, which will remain open until the new pump track is open;
- A storage shed;
- A new car park; and
- Associated civil, electrical, lighting and landscaping works.

"The Kirkham Park BMX Facility will be a real drawcard for Camden. I really look forward to seeing our local kids learn, have a go and enjoy themselves," Mayor Therese Fedeli said.

This project is partly funded by the NSW Government's Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund.

WORK PROGRESSING ON FERGUSON'S LAND

Work has been progressing on the highly-anticipated cricket facility at Ferguson's Land in Camden.

To date, the site now has:

- A new amenities building;
- Completed field profiles and drainage work;
- New fencing and cricket nets;
- Water services connections; and
- Near-complete bridge and landscaping work.

Over the next few months, the site will see the:

- Completion of road and bridge work;
- Resealing of Exeter Street;
- Relocation of the water main; and
- Electrical connection work.

This facility is scheduled to be open by December 2021.

This project is joint-funded by Camden Council, the Parkland City Liveability Program and Metropolitan Greenspace Program.

Macquarie Grove Reserve

A wire rope fencing with two gates for maintenance access have been installed around the perimeter of Macquarie Grove Reserve. Council worked in consultation with surrounding residents to remove the ability for anti-social behaviour, improve road safety at the location and ensure the amenity of residents.

McCrae Drive playground

Upgrades to the McCrae Drive playground, in Camden South, are now complete. This project included:

- Installation of new playground equipment and park furniture:
- Replacement of softfall rubber; and
- Landscaping works.

Royal George Drive playground

Upgrades to the Royal George Drive playground, in Harrington Park, are now complete. This project included:

- Installation of new playground equipment and park furniture;
- Replacement of soft-fall rubber; and
- Landscaping works.

Yandel'ora Reserve fitness equipment

Upgrades to the fitness equipment at Yandel'ora Reserve, in Mount Annan, are now complete. This project included:

- Installation of new contemporary fitness equipment as well as park furniture and a bubbler;
- · Replacement of softfall rubber; and
- · Landscaping works.

KEEP TO 50 ON OUR LOCAL STREETS

Did you know in Camden, on average, 26 people are injured in speed related crashes on local streets every year?

The 50km/h default urban speed limit applies to all built-up areas across NSW and applies as soon as you turn onto any urban road, with or without a speed sign. Reduced speed limits at school zones, road works and other special areas still apply.

COUNCIL'S COMMUNITY CENTRES TO BE POWERED BY THE SUN

Council recently received \$20,000 under the Australian Government's 'Stronger Communities' program to install solar generation systems on Julia Reserve, Catherine Park, Gregory Hills and Glenmore Park Community Centres.

The solar systems will help to reduce electricity costs at these important community facilities by providing green energy. The new systems will complement existing solar systems installed at five other Council facilities, with a combined capacity of over 360 kilowatts.

IT'S TIME TO RECYCLESMART

Talk about a match made in heaven – Camden Council has teamed up with RecycleSmart, an app that makes recycling the tough stuff as easy as ordering Uber Eats!

The app provides specific and localised information on how to correctly dispose of over 250 waste items. From glass to batteries, towels to chemicals and even DVDs to kettles, you can now find the answers at your fingertips.

Residents are invited to download the free app and check the next collection day suitable to them. The bookable Power Pickup service is also available through the app, which takes care of problem waste items like soft plastics, clothing and e-waste. Simply:

- Fill a RecycleSmart bag (or your own) with all those tough-to-recycle items and book a Power Pickup in a few clicks; and
- For just \$2 a bag, the RecycleSmart team will come to your doorstep and ensure your waste is properly recycled. Every bag collected is weighed to help you keep track of your recycling records!

At the moment, 20 per cent of red bin waste could be recycled – so help Council keep it out of landfill and keep our community beautiful!


