Local Traffic Committee

Background

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is legislated as the Authority responsible for the control of traffic on all NSW Roads. In order to deal with the large number and range of traffic related matters, TfNSW has delegated certain aspects of the control of traffic on local roads to Council (under the Transport Administration Act 1988). To exercise this delegation, Councils must establish a Local Traffic Committee (LTC) and obtain the advice of the TfNSW and NSW Police.

Role of the Committee

The LTC is primarily a technical review and advisory committee which considers the technical merits of proposals and ensures that current technical guidelines are considered. It provides recommendations to Council on traffic and parking control matters and the provision of traffic control facilities and prescribed traffic control devices for which Council has delegated authority. The Committee also advises on traffic matters arising from development applications (regulatory signage and line marking only), special events and road safety issues.

Committee Delegations

The LTC has no decision-making powers. Council must refer all traffic related matters to the Local Traffic Committee prior to exercising its delegated functions. Matters related to State Roads or functions that have not been delegated to Council must be referred directly to the TfNSW or relevant organisation.

The Committee provides recommendations to Council. Council is not bound by the advice of its LTC. Council can choose not to proceed with a recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee by not endorsing it at a Council Meeting where the minutes are presented.

Should Council wish to act contrary to the advice of the Committee or if that advice is not supported unanimously by the Committee members, Council must write to both the TfNSW and NSW Police, who may then choose to appeal to the Regional Traffic Committee within 14 days.

Committee Membership

The LTC is made up of four formal voting members. The members are as follows:

- one representative of Council as nominated by Council;
- one representative of the NSW Police from each Local Area Command (LAC) within the LGA;
- one representative from the TfNSW; and
- the local State Member(s) of Parliament (MP) or their nominee.

Where the Council area is represented by more than one MP or covered by more than one Police LAC, representatives are only permitted to vote on matters within their electorate or LAC.



The role of the four voting members is to:

- review the information provided to the committee.
- advise whether or not the technical justification of facilities meet the relevant guidelines and standards (facilities include lines, signs and devices).
- ensure that the recommendations conform to the matters being referred to and should be recommended for Council to endorse.

In relation to this:

- I. The council representatives and Local Members of Parliament (or representative) typically consider the interests of Council and its constituents. Both representatives on the Committee provide valued local knowledge.
- II. The Transport for NSW (TfNSW) representative provides advice on compliance of the matters with regards to various standards and guidelines.
- III. The NSW Police representative provides input on implications for the road network, particularly where a proposal may affect road safety.

The Committee may also have additional informal (non-voting) advisors. These may include:

- Council Officers
- Chamber of Commerce representatives
- Bus Operator representatives
- Other representatives as determined from time to time.

The informal advisors are not required to attend every LTC meeting. Their attendance is only necessary when items appear on the Agenda which affect their area of expertise or responsibility. The informal advisors are not entitled to a vote.

Please note there is no public gallery for these meetings.

LTC Business Paper

Council is responsible for preparing an LTC agenda and circulates to all formal members and informal advisors of the committee approximately one week prior to the meeting. This will allow members to fully consider the issues and determine their response on each item.

Council encourages each member of the LTC to undertake a site visit prior to considering any proposal. Site visits may be undertaken individually or organised with Council's Traffic Engineer(s).

SUBJECT: MANLIUS AVENUE, LEPPINGTON - SIGNAGE AND LINE-MARKING AT

INGLEBURN ROAD INTERSECTION

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for additional signage and line-marking in Manlius Avenue.

BACKGROUND

Development is ongoing in the Leppington Town Centre precinct. Interim restrictions have been installed to prohibit right turning on to Ingleburn Road. Additional signage and line-marking is proposed to further reinforce the restriction.

MAIN REPORT

Ingleburn Road is a two-lane rural collector road with unsealed shoulders along most of its length. Manlius Avenue is a new town centre road adjacent to the shopping centre and parallel with Rickard Road that intersections with Ingleburn Road at the southern end (see **Attachment 1**). The road layout has been devised, prohibiting the right turn from Manlius Avenue into Ingleburn Road with a Left Turn Only sign (R2-14 (L)) and arrow. This was given concurrence by the Local Traffic Committee in May 2022.

Concerns have been raised that drivers are unclear that right turn movements are not permitted. A No Right Turn sign is proposed opposite Manlius Avenue, on the southern side of Ingleburn Road. A line-marked triangular island is also proposed at the Give Way line (see **Attachment 2**).

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The signage removal works are estimated to cost \$750. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2024/25 financial year.

CONCLUSION

To reinforce the banned right turn from Manlius Avenue into Ingleburn Road, it is recommended that the Committee supports additional signage and line-marking.



RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Manlius Avenue, Leppington, at the intersection with Ingleburn Road:


- i. A No Right Turn (R2-6n(R) sign; and
- ii. A line-marked triangular median island.

SUBJECT: O'KEEFE DRIVE, ORAN PARK - NO RIGHT TURN RESTRICTIONS AND

PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT BARRAMURRA PUBLIC SCHOOL

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for timed right turn restrictions at the intersection of O'Keefe Drive and Battersby Avenue and parking restrictions along O'Keefe Drive, Oran Park.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding right turn movements at the intersection of Battersby Avenue with O'Keefe Drive. Timed right turn restrictions are proposed at the intersection. Barramurra Public School has also requested changes to parking restrictions within the indented bay along O'Keefe Drive. A timed Bus Zone and parking for mobility impaired is proposed.

MAIN REPORT

O'Keefe Drive is a collector road in Oran Park. Barramurra Public School fronts O'Keefe Drive along the north-eastern section. **Attachment 1**.

The school has requested the existing timed No Parking (8am-9:30am 2:30pm-4pm School Days) restrictions to be replaced with 15.6 metres disability parking (R5-10sigange) and 38 metres timed Bus Zone (8:30am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School days) (R65-20 signage). This is to better accommodate for the needs of the school. **Attachment 2**.

Council has also received correspondence regarding queuing along O'Keefe Drive, during the school pick-up period, due to motorists waiting to turn right into Battersby Avenue when the indented drop off and pick up bays are occupied. The awaiting vehicles cause traffic to queue south along O'Keefe Drive. Furthermore, to deter motorists queuing along Battersby Avenue and undertaking manoeuvres when turning right onto O'Keefe Drive, it is proposed to implement time No Right Turn (R2-6n signage) restrictions (2:30pm-3:30pm School Days). **Attachment 3**.

Community consultation regarding the right turn restrictions was undertaken with affected owners and occupiers. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,600.



CONCLUSION

Following concerns about queuing along O'Keefe Drive during school pick up periods it is proposed to implement timed No Right Turn restrictions at the intersection of O'Keefe Drive with Battersby Avenue. Also, to meet Barramurra Public School requirements, it is proposed to replace the existing timed No Parking restrictions with a combination of disability parking and timed Bus Zone.


RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in O'Keefe Drive, Oran Park, in the vicinity of Barramurra Public School:

- i. Replacing existing No Parking (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School days) with 15.6 metres of disability parking and 38 metres of Bus Zone (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School days); and
- ii. No Right Turn restrictions (2:30pm-3:30pm School Days) into and out of Battersby Avenue.





SUBJECT: BLUETT DRIVE, SMEATON GRANGE - NO STOPPING RESTRICTIONS

AT INTERSECTION WITH LONE PINE PLACE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for No Stopping restrictions at the intersection of Bluette Drive with Lone Pine Place, Smeaton Grange.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding vehicles obstructing sightlines when parked near the intersection of Bluette Drive with Lone Pine Place. No Stopping restrictions are proposed to address this.

MAIN REPORT

Bluett Drive is a 13-metre-wide local road in the Smeaton Grange industrial precinct, (see **Attachment 1**).

Lone Pine Place intersects with Bluett Drive forming a modified T-intersection. Concerns have been raised that when vehicles are parked along the western side of the intersection, sightlines are obstructed for vehicles leaving Lone Pine Place. It is therefore proposed to implement of No Stopping (r5-400 signage) restrictions to maintain sight lines. See **Attachment 2**.

Consultation was undertaken with surrounding owners and occupiers. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,000.

CONCLUSION

Following concerns about vehicles parking near the intersection of Bluett Drive with Lone Pine Place, it is recommended that the committee supports the installation of No Stopping restrictions.



RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Bluett Drive, Smeaton Grange, at the intersection with Lone Pine, No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions for 40 metres the western side.

SUBJECT: HACKING DRIVE, NARELLAN VALE - NO STOPPING RESTRICTIONS

AND GIVE WAY TREATMENT AT INTERSECTION WITH

WATERWORTH DRIVE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for give way treatment and No Stopping restrictions at the intersection of Hacking Drive with Waterworth Drive.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding vehicles parking too close to the intersection of Hacking Drive and Waterworth Drive, compromising traffic flow and safety concerns leaving Hacking Drive and entering Waterworth Drive. No Stopping restrictions and a give way treatment are proposed to address this.

MAIN REPORT

Hacking Drive is a 9-metre-wide local road in Narellan Vale which intersects at either end with Waterworth Drive (see **Attachment 1**).

Vehicles have been observed parked close to the intersection at the eastern end near Elizabeth Macarthur High School, particularly at school drop off and pick up times. This impedes traffic flow as the road is relatively narrow and parking on both sides obstructs the carriageway. There are existing No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions along the western and eastern side of the Intersection. Further concerns have been raised regarding sightlines at the intersection.

It is proposed to extend the No Stopping restrictions along Hacking Drive by 7 metres along the western side and 11 metres along the eastern. To further assist with delineation, it is proposed to implement a Give Way treatment aligning with the kerb extensions along Waterworth Drive. It is also proposed to install a 19 metres of double barrier lines to complement the Give Way treatment. (See **Attachment 2**).

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupants. Two responses were received. One in support of the proposal the other objecting. The objection was regarding a further extension of 22 metres timed No Stopping restrictions (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School Days) along the western side.

The proposal has been amended to not progress the timed parking component at this time. Council will continue to monitor the situation and determine if further extensions would be required in the future.



FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,000.

CONCLUSION

Following concerns about vehicles being parked close to the intersection and safety concerns at the intersection of Hacking Drive with Waterworth Drive, it is recommended that the committee supports extension of No Stopping restrictions and a Give Way treatment.


RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Hacking Drive, Narellan Vale, at the eastern intersection with Waterworth Drive:

- i. No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions extended for 7 metres along the western side and 11 metres along the eastern side;
- ii. Give Way signage (R1-2) and line-marking (TB/TB1); and
- iii. 19 metres of double barrier (BB) centre line.

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SUBJECT: HUME STREET, NARELLAN - NO STOPPING RESTRICTIONS AT

INTERSECTION WITH QUEEN STREET

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for No Stopping restrictions at the intersection of Hume Street with Queen Street, Narellan.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding vehicles obstructing sightlines when parked near the intersection of Hume Street with Queen Street. No Stopping restrictions are proposed to address this.

MAIN REPORT

Hume Street is a 7.2-metre-wide local road in Narellan which intersects with Queen Street at the north-eastern end. This is a busy town centre location with a medical centre on the opposite side of Queen Street and a childcare centre on the north-western corner of intersection (see **Attachment 1**).

There is an existing No Stopping restriction along the western side of Queen Street, south of Hume Street, complementing a traffic island. However, it creates confusion as there are no signed restrictions around the intersection into Hume Street. The northern side of Hume Street has no signed restrictions and vehicles have been regularly observed parked too close to the intersection.

It is proposed to implement No Stopping restrictions on either side of Hume Street for 12 metres, to accommodate the pram ramps, and along the western side of Queen Street for 10 metres in either direction (see **Attachment 2**).

Consultation was undertaken with surrounding owners and occupiers. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$600.

CONCLUSION



Following concerns about vehicles parking near the intersection of Hume Street with Queen Street, it is recommended that the committee supports the installation of No Stopping restrictions.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends Council approves in Hume Street, Narellan, at the intersection with Queen Street:

- i. No Stopping restrictions (R5-400 signage) along both sides of Hume Street for 12 metres; and
- ii. No Stopping restrictions (R5-400 signage) for 10 metres in either direction along the western side of Queen Street.

SUBJECT: OLD HUME HIGHWAY, CAMDEN - WOMBAT CROSSING AT CAMDEN

SOUTH PUBLIC SCHOOL

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for signage and line marking associated with the implementation of a wombat crossing in Old Hume Highway, Camden.

BACKGROUND

Council has received concerns regarding pedestrian safety as pedestrians seek to access Camden South Public School. A wombat crossing is proposed to help address the concerns.

MAIN REPORT

Old Hume Highway is a collector road in Camden with a 13-metre-wide carriageway. There is an existing hybrid zebra / children's crossing with kerb extensions, at Camden South Public School. The location is shown on **Attachment 1**.

Concerns have been raised by Camden South Public School that vehicles are not slowing down for pedestrians accessing the school, placing them at risk. It is proposed to address this safety concern by raising the crossing (see **Attachment 2**). This project also requires associated drainage works. Flood lighting is already in place.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The works are estimated to cost \$100,000. The project is funded from a grant from TfNSW in 2024/25.

CONCLUSION

The provision of a wombat crossing on Old Hume Highway will enhance pedestrian safety at Camden South Public School, and it is recommended that the Committee supports the proposal.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Old Hume Highway, Camden, a wombat crossing with associated signage and line-marking as detailed in drawing number P_101724 C009/11 Rev. 2.

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

SUBJECT: CORNUTA CLOSE, NARELLAN VALE - EXTENSION OF TIMED NO

STOPPING RESTRICTIONS

FROM: Director Community Assets

EDMS #: 24/373458

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the extension of timed No Stopping restrictions in Cornuta Close, Narellan Vale.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding parked vehicles obstructing access and traffic flow along the section of Cornuta Close.

MAIN REPORT

Cornuta Close is 5.8-metre-wide cul-de-sac road located near Narellan Vale Public School. There is existing timed No Stopping (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School days) (R5-402n signage) restrictions along the eastern side extending to the southwestern side at the end of the cul-de-sac (see **Attachment 1**).

Concern has been raised regarding parked vehicles impeding traffic flow and access within the road when dropping off and picking up school students. It is proposed to extend the existing restrictions 8.5 metres northwards, along the western side of the road (see **Attachment 2**).

Consultation was undertaken with affected owners and occupiers. Three responses were received. Two in favour of the proposal and one opposing. The responses in favour commended that the proposal would assist in maintaining access to and from properties. The response opposing the proposal stated that the removal of parking will impact on surrounding streets and that Cornuta Close is a considerably safer location to drop-off and pick-up students.

Council response: the extension of the parking restrictions by 8.5 metres would result in the loss of one car parking space during the timed period. This is not likely to have a significant impact on the surrounding streets and would serve to maintain access to adjacent lots during the timed period.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The cost of the recommended work is \$400. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year.

CONCLUSION

To maintain access and traffic flow it is recommended to extend the timed No Stopping restrictions.



To advise the Local Traffic Committee of local behavioural campaigns being undertaken to improve road safety and community safety in the Camden Local Government Area.

BACKGROUND

The Community and Road Safety Action Plan is developed on a yearly basis to provide direction to the Community Road Safety Officer (CRSO). Projects and programs that are implemented in the Camden Local Government Area (LGA) are developed from both research and statistical analysis undertaken.

This report outlines the progress of projects being implemented in the 2024/25 financial year.
