A legacy for the people of Macarthur, this beautiful collection of works provides a glimpse of life in 20th century Australia captured by the world class fine artist Alan D. Baker.

The collection tells a story of life, Australian tradition, culture and the artistic journey of the artist. The contemplative works evoke emotion as they reveal their stories of love, family, community, war, beauty, darkness and tragedy; each capturing history.

Few collections worldwide embrace the complete life of the artist, family and their place within the community. Here, Baker reveals the people and places of Macarthur, the role he played in developing an arts network in Camden and his influence over many artists who inspired by Baker started their own careers and practice till this day.


The works displayed capture 60 years of the artist's journey. The portraits of himself, his wife, children and father are incredible, his land and seascapes reflect truth in their honest representation, and the depth and rare beauty of his floral and still life work sets Baker apart from others.

Many of Baker's commercial works are hung in the Tooth and Co exhibition in the Powerhouse museum. The collection has examples of the early commercial art using the last old colour printing techniques. These works are historical. They reflect society of the day, lifestyle and aspirations of the 1950's.

Both Alan and his wife Marjorie experienced the great depression of the 30s as teenagers, war, the rebuilding of life after war as a young couple, the ultimate family tragedy with the loss of their two sons and the hope and prosperity of the late 20th century as they worked diligently together to capture their passion. A passion that drove Baker to achieve artistic expression that brought magnificent and beautiful art to life and posterity.

Art was a haven from which the memories came; a place that enabled him to reflect and create beauty in paint. His collection is offered as a reflection of the lives of all who lived during these times.

Council's vision for making Camden's heritage accessible to the community has been brought to life through the Art Gallery at *Macaria* featuring works of renowned artist Alan Baker.





Works of this era represent Bakers artistic development in the 32 years prior to residing in Macarthur. During this period he completed art school, began work as an art tutor, served Australia in WWII, married Marjorie with whom he celebrated the birth of his three sons, faced family tragedy, embarked on a flourishing commercial art career and earnt his reputation as a sought after portrait painter.





Baker as a portrait painter was known for his ability to capture the personality and life of his subjects on a one dimensional surface. The room features Baker's last self-portrait, the portrait of his artist wife Marjorie 'Lady In Pink', the heartbreaking image of his son Brian 'Boy in a Raincoat', a portrait of his youngest son 'Gary' and that of his beloved father 'Henry Baker'.





Throughout the 1970's and 1980's Baker played an influential role in the establishment of the Camden Art Group, assisting to activate an arts movement in Camden. The small group meeting at Camden Public School was free for anyone to attend. It was at these meetings that Alan imparted his artistic knowledge by demonstrating his techniques. The group of like-minded friends, who were very serious about their art, began sketching and painting. Alan, with his distinct technique influenced and transformed the lives of his students, many later becoming recognised artists in their own right.

Baker displays a profound commitment to the natural and man-made environment, reflecting history, and capturing Australian landscape and seascape in its truest form. A lover of plein air painting, Baker would take his masonite board painstakingly sealed, and stippled with white lead paint to create the perfect textured finish in readiness for his vigorous work. He would choose his location, battle the elements and sit to paint, his torso remaining extremely active as the fluid energy of his work flowed. He would paint until his work was complete ready to exhibit.


THE HISTORY OF MACARIA

The township of Camden was established in the 1840s by James and William Macarthur. Henry Thompson built *Macaria* in 1859-60 for the purpose of a school. Henry Thompson and his brother Samuel came to Camden as independent investors, setting up a general store and steam flour mill.

Macaria has been used as a private home; the Camden Grammar School; and as a residence and practice of doctors, including the popular Dr West from 1901 to 1932. In 1965 it was bought by Camden Council and was used as Camden Library and offices for the Mayor, Town Clerk and staff.

Macaria has gabled windows, high chimneys, and stone trims with wooden porch and verandah. It is a fine early townhouse of distinctive and interesting architectural quality, associated with important figures of the town's early years. For a house of its scale, it is among the best picturesque Gothic houses in Australia. This, when combined with its importance to Camden, makes it a building of great significance.
