


STRATEGY REVIEW IN

The Camden Youth Strategy 2022-26 is currently at its mid-way point. Results indicate a trajectory towards exceeding the goals set forth within the strategy. Of the 27 actions identified, 24 are complete or on-going, 3 are on-track however, need attention and none are off track or incomplete.









SEVERAL KEY HIGHLIGHTS HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED, INCLUDING:

OVER \$100,000

in successful grant applications received from the NSW State Government to deliver projects associated with this strategy. This funding enabled us to deliver the Camden Joblink Program, the Camden United Resilience Basketball program (CURB) and both the 2023 and 2024 Youth Week programs.

Camden Council remains committed to the young people of Camden, along with supporting the services, schools and local structures that support them. This document is designed to create transparency around the delivery of this strategy. Whilst also encouraging further collaboration between service providers, the three levels of government and residents when supporting Camden's young people.



YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID INITIATIVE

OVERVIEW OF INITIATIVE:

The Youth Mental Health First Aid initiative, is derived from action 1.4 of the Camden Youth Strategy.

"Delivery of subsidised youth mental health training for young people, teachers or other people who directly support or are in regular contact with young people".

Whilst the success for this action was set at the delivery of one course per year, this has significantly exceeded expectations. This initiative has seen fantastic outcomes with over 80 participants completing this course fully subsidised, with many additional spaces being made available over the next two years.

Participants, post event surveys, indicated positive outcomes as a result of the delivery of this course, as can be seen below:

RESULTS:

80+ participants completed the course so far

The following scores are an average out of 5 and are based on a post-training self-reflection survey and indicates the success of this course:

How confident do you feel recognising signs of mental health problems	4.78
How confident do you feel approaching someone going through a mental health crisis	4.9
How confident do you feel asking someone if they are having suicidal thoughts	4.85
How confident are you to offer support and information about mental health	4.9
How confident are you to encourage access to support for mental health	4.8
How confident are you to recognise misconceptions about mental health	4.88







SCHOOL SERVICES EXPO'S

The School Services Expo's were developed to raise awareness amongst young people for the services that are available to them in our local community. These expos came about due to the overwhelming number of young people who identified that they were unaware of the support services available and that awareness raising should take place within schools.

These expo's involved service providers attending schools to set up stalls and activities that aimed to raise awareness about their service and the supports they offer. Every student from within the school then had the opportunity to engage with the service, one-year group at a time.

So far, six school services expo's have taken place with plans to continue these throughout the life of the strategy. The six schools that have participated include:

- · Elizabeth Macarthur High School;
- · Oran Park High School;
- Camden High School;
- Mount Annan High School;
- · Elderslie High School; and
- · Oran Park Anglian High School.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF THIS?

These results indicate a significant improvement in awareness and access to services for local young people. As young people identified a lack of awarenesses for services that can support them in the original youth strategy consultation, this demonstrates a significant improvement due to the delivery of these expos.

WHAT'S NEXT?

We will continue to deliver these services expos throughout the life of the strategy, ensuring young people across the LGA have an improved awareness for the support available to them. Council, with the support of the Camden Youth Network, will also deliver a wellbeing expo outside of a school context to help educate the broader community about the services available for young people.





CAMDEN JOBLINK PROGRAM

The Camden JobLink program was designed to provide direct links between young people and local employers. The program includes the delivery of the Career Expo events and fully subsidised training for local young people seeking employment.

The program was successfully funded in 2022/23 through the NSW Governments Youth Opportunities program. Council will continue to deliver subsidised training opportunities and career expo events throughout the remainder of the strategy to ensure youth employment remains a priority within Camden.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT OF THIS?

The Camden JobLink program has created a direct link for young people to gain meaningful, local employment. The delivery of subsidised training opportunities and career expo style projects ensures young people are given more equitable access to the local workforce and economy.

It is an opportunity to celebrate their contributions to our community, highlight their individual and collective strengths and connect young people to the Camden community. The Camden Youth Strategy action 3.4 demonstrates Council's commitment to this program.

JULIA RESERVE YOUTH

COMMUNITY CENTRE

Since the endorsement of this strategy, Council has identified the operational need to employ a full time Community Project Officer to support the delivery and expansion of the Julia Reserve Youth & Community Centre model. This investment has seen a significant flow on effect to improving the outcomes for young people within the LGA. Julia Reserve currently boasts the co-location of 16 youth services that provide holistic wrap around support for local young people. The centre has been featured in the NSW Governments Key Tenants of Good Youth Work report as a best practice model and has been featured as an exceptional example of youth participation by the office of the Advocate for Children and Young People.

WHAT ARE WE FOCUSING ON NEXT?

The Camden Youth Strategy (2022-2026) is on-track to exceed the actions set forth in the original strategy. Hence, there is an opportunity to focus on areas that require improvement and set new ambitious targets to support young people within the LGA.

The actions that have been identified as requiring additional attention in the second half of the delivery of this strategy, are:

- 1.5 Appropriate advertisement of youth mental health services through Council websites and social media platforms.
- 2.1 Advertisement of local employment opportunities and services through a centralised hub.
- 3.5 Ensuring young people can voice their opinions around local sustainability practices.

Council also recently held a Principals' Forum which will guide new actions to support children and young people specifically in a schooling context, these actions include but are not limited to:

- i.) Development of a resource for schools listing all services available in the area to support families. To also include FREE and Low-Cost Programs that are available to connect young people to the Camden community.
- ii.) Coordination of an annual parenting workshop at Julia Reserve


 Community Centre that is open and advertised through all local schools.
- iii.) Development of a Mayor's award for school students for recognition of student engagement and other relevant attributes.

COMMUNITY INDICATORS

Throughout the remainder of this strategy, Council is committed to working towards the following community indicators.

- 1.) Young people in Camden have a say about things that impact them.
- 2.) Young people in Camden are safe, both at home and in our community
- 3.) Young people feel connected to the Camden Community.
- 4.) Young people in Camden have access to support and are aware of how to access support services.

Council therefore encourages organisations, government agencies, community members and young people themselves to reach out to staff to see how you can contribute to this strategy and how to best support young people throughout the remainder of this strategy.
