ORAN PARK LEISURE CENTRE

Located at 74 Central Avenue, Oran Park, the Oran Park Leisure Centre is set to become a major asset to the precinct.

With a project budget of \$63.3M and co-funding from Greenfields Development Company and Council, the facility will encompass aquatic, indoor sports and health and fitness areas, catering to the diverse interests and age groups of the Camden LGA.

Serving as a multipurpose community hub, it will foster social connections and cohesion, bridging the existing Library and Camden Council Administration Building.

With works on track, the project is set to open later this year.

LINKING CAMDEN TO THE NEPEAN

Winding paths through beautiful landscapes adorned with unique art – it's not just a dream, but a reality: the Nepean River Walk is officially open!

Celebrating in style, Council invited the Camden LGA to join in the unveiling of the highly anticipated walking track with live music, guided walking tours, and of course, tasty food vendors to get attendees energised for the first walk of the 4km trail!

The opening event marked a significant milestone for Camden Council's efforts to enhance public spaces along the Nepean River. Following the successful \$5.1 million grant application, the project aimed to extend recreational pathways, install viewing platforms, and create a public art trail, among other improvements.

The opening ceremony featured traditional rituals, speeches, and the unveiling of the official plaque by Mayor Ashleigh Cagney.

Thank you to all those who attended the official opening at the Ferguson Land Cricket Facility to celebrate this exciting new public space of Camden.


The project was funded through the NSW Government Public Spaces Legacy Program.

JOHN STREET UPGRADE AND ACTIVATION PROJECT

Council is currently investigating how we can enhance John Street to make it a vibrant, creative, community hub.

In 2017, people and businesses shared their aspirations for the Camden Town Centre as part of the development of the Camden Town Centre Urban Design Framework. At this time, John Street was identified as a future creative and community hub for Camden, and improvements to support this vision were identified as a priority project for our community.

Now, thanks to significant funding by the NSW Government's Western Sydney Infrastructure Grants Program, we are in a position to actively plan for this project, which will see investment in the John Street Precinct between Broughton and Exeter Streets.

Throughout June, we carried out further consultation with the community by popping into a number of places, including John Street, Camden Produce Market and Camden Library. There'll be more opportunities for you to engage with us and share your thoughts soon.

The NSW Electoral Commission (NSWEC), in consultation with Camden Council, will administer the Camden Council election for 2024.


Council is composed of nine Councillors across three Wards

HELP GET YOUR BIN EMPTIED ON BIN DAY

Remember on bin day to leave enough space to allow for safe rubbish collection.

Place your bin on the kerbside at least 1m away from any cars, trees, poles, fences and other structures. Bins too close to obstructions may not be emptied as it can lead to damage to property and vehicles.

All rubbish must be inside the bin-bags and items placed beside them will not be collected. Also, ensure your bin lid is closed to prevent animals getting in and spreading your rubbish.

Important reminder: Never dispose of hazardous items such as batteries, gas bottles, or motor oils in your bins as it may lead to truck fires and serious damage!

For the safety of our community, drivers and residents, we urge everyone to give batteries a safe goodbye. Take these items to your nearest Community Recycling Centre for FREE disposal.

THREATENED SPECIES ART AND WRITING COMPETITION

OPEN BURNING

Open burning or backyard burning is strictly prohibited in the Camden Local Government Area, including all rural areas, and is regulated throughout NSW by the Protection of the Environment (Clean Air) Regulation 2021.

This regulation aims to minimise air pollution associated with burning, such as smoke from burning wood, rubbish and vegetation, which can cause major repercussions.

Certain exemptions apply, such as hazard reduction works where a Hazard Reduction Certificate has been issued by the NSW Rural Fire Service. Exemptions may also be granted for certain agricultural operations and cooking fires.

GUNDUNGURRA RESERVE MANAGEMENT

The implementation of a 20-year Management Plan for Gundungurra Reserve North and South has recently begun as part of the delivery of a BioBanking Agreement for the bushland reserves.

This plan aims to enhance and protect the endangered Cumberland Plain Woodland, as well as the threatened plant and animal species within the bushland ecosystem.

Works will soon commence, including fencing, signage installation and weed and pest control efforts. Additional planting is planned for the sites in the coming years. For further information, contact sustainability@camden.nsw.gov.au or call 13 CAMDEN (13 226336).

NUGGET BEAMES ARTWORK

Local Indigenous artist, Melissa Barton, worked with students from Elizabeth Macarthur High School to develop a site-specific mural, responding to input from the students in a series of workshops.

ALAN BAKER ART EXHIBITION

The Alan Baker Art Gallery's latest exhibition, Camden Art Collections showcases Camden's rich art history by opening the Camden Council Public Art and the Alan Baker Art Gallery collections for public viewing.

The Exhibition, located in historic Macaria, features a selection ofeatures a selection of oil, acrylic and watercolour paintings, graphite and pastel drawings, sculpture and collage spanning from the 1970s to late 1980s. - Unlock Camden History Talk at Camden Library.




