Moderate

Typical habit:
Found along the east coast of Australia, it thrives in coastal regions, sandy soils and heathlands

Foliage:
Simple leaves that are generally whorled, medium green coloured

Flowers:
Flower spikes usually appear in autumn and winter. When in bud, they appear as a bluish-green but turn yellow-green when flowers open.

Site requirements:
Full sun position with a reliable source of moisture. It is not considered drought resistant.
