It is found on the east coast, ranges and the slopes on the western side of the ranges. It grows in dry sclerophyll forest in sandy soil.

Foliage:

Lime green glossy foliage

Flowers

flowers during most months of the year, resting only in extremes of heat and cold, and with flushes in autumn and spring.

Site requirements:

A sheltered position in sandy soil is the ideal situation but *Crowea* exalata will grow well in richer soil in half to full sun, with some care whilst it becomes established
