
THE CAMDEN LOCAL **GOVERNMENT AREA**

Camden covers an area of 201 square kilometres and is bisected by the Nepean River. As of October 2023, the Camden population is more than 127,000 residents. Despite the considerable growth experienced since the 1980's, Camden has maintained its unique character, based on its historical importance and picturesque rural landscapes.

YOUR COUNCILLORS

Camden Council is comprised of three wards (North, Central and South) with three representatives from each ward.

Local Government elections are held every four years in the month of September.

The main responsibilities of the elected Council are

- exercise leadership;
- listen to the problems and ideas of the local community; and
- be the custodian and trustee of city assets and to account for and manage those assets.

The Mayor is elected by the Councillors bi-annually in September. The Mayor's office is located in the Camden Council Administration Building at 70 Central Ave, Oran Park.

Appointments can be made by ringing Council during business hours on 13 22 63.



COUNCIL MEETINGS

Camden Council meets regularly to discuss local issues and make decisions on behalf of the community. Decisions are made at an open meeting by the whole Council. All meetings of Council are open to the public and residents are welcome to attend.

Ordinary Council Meetings are generally held on the second Tuesday of every month at 6.30pm, at the Council Chambers located in the Camden Council Administration Building in Oran Park.

Are you in need of a venue for an event, party, or activity? Camden Council has a variety of community facilities available for casual or regular hire. Bookings can be made via Bookable.





CAMDEN LIBRARIES

Camden Libraries provide a free space for people to meet, participate in programs and events, learn, find information, and feel connected to the community.

Residents are invited to become members of Camden Library Services free of charge. To join, you will need to show personal identification, with your name and current address.

Camden Library is made up of a variety of spaces perfect for different members of the community. With sunlight streaming in from the beautiful glass roof, this is a quiet place to visit in the centre of historic Camden. The Camden Museum is also within this complex and is well worth a visit.

Narellan Library is colourful and spacious with an indoor and outdoor play area for young children, a computer lab and recording studio.

Oran Park Library is a stunning and large complex built on the old Oran Park Raceway with some incredible artworks made from repurposed car and motorcycle parts.

Library resources are available both online and physically in the libraries. Our library staff are happy to assist with your recreational reading, learning and informational needs.

The libraries have free computer and internet access, Wi-Fi, printing and photocopying facilities, and meeting and study rooms.

Camden Libraries is more than just books, with a full program of events for people of all ages from visiting authors, art workshops, and technology workshops to Storytime and holiday programs for children and youth.

Camden Libraries also provides a home library delivery service. This service is free to anyone living in the Camden area who is unable to visit the library due to disability, illness, limited mobility, or the need to care for someone in any of those categories.

JUSTICE OF THE PEACE

Do you need the services of a Justice of the Peace (JP)? Need a document witnessed or a Statutory Declaration signed?

Local JPs in the Macarthur area volunteer their services at:

- **Camden Council Administration Building** Monday to Friday, 8.30am-5pm (Limit of 10 pages). If you need more than 10 pages signed, visit bit.ly/camdenpublicregister
- **Camden Library** every Thursday, 10am-12pm.
- **Narellan Town Centre** every Saturday, 10am-12pm; and
- Camden Court House.

RATES INFORMATION

Rates are levied for the 12-month period from 1 July to 30 June and rate instalments are due for payment on 31 August, 30 November, 28 February, and 31 May. Council will send out quarterly notices approximately five weeks before each instalment is due. Interest accrues daily on unpaid Rates and Charges after the due date.

CITIZENSHIP

To apply for citizenship, you must be a legal, permanent resident of Australia, be of good character and have resided in Australia for at



least two of the last five years. As part of all citizenship ceremonies, the Mayor will outline the rights and responsibilities of Australian citizenship and the new citizen must take an oath or affirmation of allegiance to Australia. PETS & **PEOPLE**

THINGS TO DO FOR YOUR PET WHEN YOU MOVE HOUSE

When people move house they often forget that information about their pets also needs changing incase your pet becomes lost or injured.

Your pet, once microchipped, is placed onto the Companion Animal Register and this information is accessed if your pet becomes lost. Here are important steps to ensure your pet's details are correct and up to date.

- Make sure your pet is microchipped. Your local vet can assist with this.
- 2. Once your pet is microchipped, visit Council to have your pet lifetime registered.
- 3. Make sure your pet is wearing a collar and name tag with an up-to-date contact number.
- 4. Change your contact details with Council to ensure your new address and phone number are up to date. Forms can be obtained from Council and online at Council's website.
- 5. If you no longer own a microchipped pet or your pet has recently died, contact Council for assistance with updating your details.

Council must be notified within 14 days of any change that occurs in the registration information for your pet.

IDENTIFICATION AND REGISTRATION

Companion animals (dog or cat) must be microchipped from the time the animal is 12 weeks old by a vet or animal welfare organisation.

Your pet must be registered with Council by six months of age.

This is a separate process to microchipping and can be completed at Council's Customer Service Centres, 70 Central Avenue, Oran Park between 8.30am-5pm, Monday to Friday.



Pets can be a wonderful addition to any family, but the responsible care and management of animals by their owners is a duty that must be taken seriously to ensure safety and wellbeing of our community.

OFF-LEASH AREAS

Get active outdoors and take your dog for a walk at one of ten off-leash parks located throughout the Camden area including:

- Bicentennial Equestrian Park, Camden Council - before 10am and after 5pm, Monday to Sunday (excluding horse event periods)
- Rosevale Reserve, Narellan
- Rowland Avenue, Catherine Park
- River Road Reserve, Elderslie
- Burrell Road, Spring Farm
- Clifton Park, Arcadian Hills Estate, Clifton Drive, Cobbitty
- Silverton Street, Gregory Hills
- Holden Drive, Oran Park
- Howard Loop, Oran Park
- Emerald Hills Boulevard and Leslie Way, **Emerald Hills**

Note: It is the responsibility of the person walking the dog to remove and properly dispose of any dog's faeces.



WASTE

WASTE COLLECTION

Council provides a variety of waste services:

- Residents receive a three-bin waste service which consists of a recycling, organic waste, and garbage bins, all emptied weekly.
- Rural properties and some multi-unit dwellings are provided with a two-bin service which consists of recycling and garbage bins only.
- Residents moving into newly constructed dwellings are required to contact Council to initiate their waste service.


