Use this handy bingo card to record what you can see, hear, feel and smell while you are out and about in Mount Annan.

Remember:

- Wear sensible shoes;
- Be sun safe;
- Bring a drink bottle;
- Stay on the path;
- Look out for traffic; and
- Practice social distancing.

Count how many dogs you can see.



Look up at the sky. Can you see any birds? What type are they?

Find the tallest tree. How old do you think it is?

Imagine you're a lizard. Where would you sun yourself and what would you eat?



Take a sip of your water.

Feel the sunshine on your body.

Make sure you Slip, Slop and Slap before going outside.

Put litter in the bin.

If it's litter that you find, be safe and check with an adult first. If you can, wear gloves and make sure to use hand sanitiser afterwards.



Take a deep breath in. What can you smell?



Find a crunchy leaf.



What kind of plants can you see in the lake? Are they floating, underneath the water or growing on the banks?

Spot a waterbird with a short beak.



Listen for any insects. What insect do you think it is?

Find a rock. Is it rough or smooth?

Remember, don't turn rocks over! You don't know what might be hiding underneath!

Listen to a native bird call. What does it sound like?

Find 5 different types of insects.



Touch the trunk of a tree. Is it rough or smooth?

Look at a floating wetland. Can you see any animals interacting with it?



Have a snack break.

Remember to put your rubbish in the bin after you're finished.

Find a playground.



Move 10 steps, what can you see from your new position?

Stop and listen for one minute. What noises can you hear?

Spot some wildflowers or seed pods.



What can you see on the road or path? Is it likely to harm wildlife if it washes into the creek or lakes when it rains? Careful not to step out onto the road!

Smell a flower or plant.



Run your hands along some plants. What do they feel like?

Careful! Some plants can be quite spiky.
